HISTORY

In 1901, construction began on Himelhoch, formerly known as the Washington Arcade Building. Colonial Frank J. Hecker's descendants owned the building until it was purchased by the Slavik organization in 1980. The building was originally designed for prestigious office and retail use. Today, Himelhoch, with its grand lobby and spacious vintage apartments, is home to seniors age 62 and over.

Originally, a shop-lined arcade traversed the ground floor from the Woodward entrance to the northern Washington Boulevard entrance. Some shops contained two floors, utilizing the mezzanine level.

The Himelhoch Brothers and Company leased the building from 1923 to 1977 for their women's department store. The early days of their store hosted the first of our auto-models, angle parked along an elegant and classically styled Washington Boulevard.

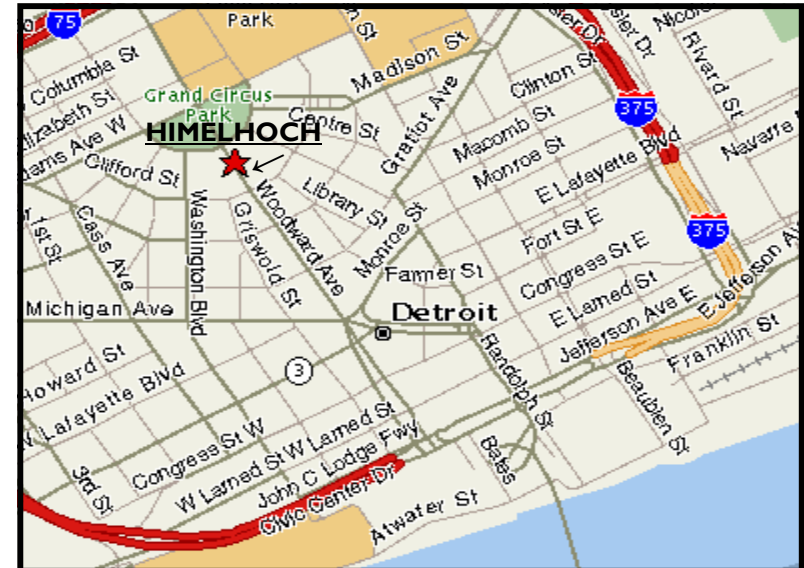
